I recommend that Cabinet note this report on my travel to Japan from 23-25 February.

Report

- The focus of my visit was to meet with Japan's CPTPP and Trade Ministers, 2 Shigeyuki Goto and Yasutoshi Nishimura, to discuss outstanding issues with the United Kingdom's (UK) accession to the Comprehensive and Progressive MinisterforTrade Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP).

The visit provided an important opportunity for political-level discussions with Japan as the Chair of the UK Accession Working Group s6(a)

Discussions with Japan have remained ongoing since then. s6(a)

A decision on substantial conclusion of the UK's accession to CPTPP was announced by Ministers on Friday 31 March.

- Alongside my CPTPP-focussed engagements, I met with New Zealand business leaders and NZTE customers in Japan (including FreshCo, ANZCO, Tātua, Comvita, Fonterra, Cookie Time, K9 Natural and Wholesum) to talk about opportunities and challenges in the Japanese market and the Government's response to Cyclone Gabrielle.
- 8 Some of the challenges and opportunities canvassed included:
 - · Crop losses from Cyclone Gabrielle
 - Demand in the food service sector starting to improve
 - A consumer preference for grain fed over grass fed beef
 - Inflation impacting consumers trading down from premium products
 - Transport infrastructure challenges
 - Market trends around animal welfare
 - Issues around true to label (eg Manuka), and a need for increased controls and standards
- This was a timely opportunity to connect with New Zealand exporters inmarket about the impacts of CPTPP, the ongoing COVID-19 and supply chain recovery, and the compounding impacts of Cyclone Gabrielle on pre-existing challenges.
