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Proposed Overseas Travel: Hon James Shaw

Portfolio Climate Change

On 14 August 2023, Cabinet:

- authorised the absence of Hon James Shaw from New Zealand, subject to leave from Parliament being secured, from 20 to 23 August 2023, to travel to Suva, Fiji to attend the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, Pacific High Level Climate Dialogue, and Pacific Climate Change Ministers' Roundtable;
- **agreed** that he be accompanied by one member of staff and the Opposition spokesperson for Climate Change;
- approved the estimated expenditure of up to \$13,500 for the travel expenses of the ministerial party as a charge to Vote: Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive Travel);
- 4 agreed that in his absence Hon David Parker act as Minister of Climate Change;
- 5 **noted** that leave from Parliament has been sought.

Proposed Overseas Travel: Hon James Shaw

- I seek Cabinet approval to travel to Suva, Fiji to attend the United Nations 1 Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) Pacific High Level Climate Dialogue and Pacific Climate Change Ministers' Roundtable from 20 to 23 August 2023.
- The Prime Minister has approved the travel in-principle, and House leave has 2 yer of Cliff been sought from the Party Musterer.

Purpose of Travel

- I propose to attend the following meetings: 3
 - 3.1 UNFCCC Pacific High Level Climate Dialogue which will support a deep level dialogue on Pacific Small Island Developing States priority issues; and
 - Australia-hosted Pacific Climate Change Ministers' Roundtable which 3.2 will be an opportunity to discuss shared priorities for a Pacific-hosted COP31.
- 4 The meeting objectives align closely with New Zealand's agreed international climate change priorities including lifting global ambition; and Pacific resilience and an empowered Pacific transition [ENV-23-MIN-0035].

Benefits of New Zealand Attendance

- 5 These meetings are particularly significant in the lead up to this year's UNFCCC Conference of the Parties, COP28. The meetings present the only Ministerial-level opportunity for Pacific pre-COP climate change discussions this year.
- 6 Effective global action has been, and remains, New Zealand's primary objective for international climate change engagement. We are at a once in five-year point in the Paris Agreement architecture, to secure a global course correction through the 'Global Stocktake' of progress in implementing the Agreement.
- 7 I expect discussions will lay the necessary foundation for securing ambitious outcomes for the Global Stocktake at COP28 through a strong and united regional voice.

The key benefits of Ministerial attendance include:

- 7.1 Lend profile and support to New Zealand's COP objectives and priorities that seek to drive ambitious action on climate change;
- 7.2 Deepen relationships with Pacific climate change ministers, and position New Zealand as an advocate for Pacific interests;
- 7.3 Demonstrate our support for Australia's bid to co-host COP31 in partnership with the Pacific and participate in discussions on how to deliver COP31 in a way that reflects regional interests.

Bilateral Meetings and Events

There are likely to be opportunities for bilateral meetings with a range of countries at senior level including the United Arab Emirates, Cook Islands, Samoa and Australia.
