Thank you for your email of 4 January 2025 in which you request the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

"I'm getting in touch under the Official Information Act to please request all plans, documents, and communication from those in leadership roles at MFAT regarding Donald Trump's presidency, and his election win - from the entirety of 2024. Please also include all plans on how the Government and the agency plans to work with the incoming administration."

On 28 January 2025, you agreed to refine the scope of your request to be for:

"Formal briefings prepared by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and sent to the Minister of Foreign Affairs primarily relating to the Trump Administration between 5 November 2024 to 21 January 2025"

#### Response to your request

In scope of your request is a briefing titled "US Election: Trump Administration Engagement Plan and Priorities" dated 17 December 2024. Some information is withheld under the following sections of the OIA:

- 6(a): to avoid prejudicing the security or defence of New Zealand or the international relations of the New Zealand Government;
- 9(2)(a): to protect individuals' privacy;
- 9(2)(f)(iv): to protect the confidentiality of advice tendered by Ministers of the Crown and officials; and
- 9(2)(g)(i): to protect the free and frank expression of opinions by departments.

Where the information has been withheld under section 9 of the OIA, no public interest in releasing the information has been identified that would override the reasons for withholding it.

Please note that it is our policy to proactively release our responses to official information requests where possible. Therefore, our response to your request (with your



2. We are closely monitoring the development of President Trump's policy proposals as he transitions into governing. His Cabinet choices so far suggest the Administration is gearing up to follow through on Trump's campaign pledges,  $^{s6(a)}$ . Clarity around the details of key decisions on trade and foreign policy may not come until after inauguration on 20 January 2025.

## Resourcing
