### Report on Overseas Travel: Hon Simon Watts - September - October 2024

I recommend that Cabinet note this report on my travel to Nadi, Fiji to attend the *Pacific Island Countries' Climate Change Ministerial Talanoa with Australia and New Zealand* on 30 September – 2 October 2024.

## Report

- The Talanoa focused on Australia's bid to host COP31 in 2026 in partnership with the Pacific. The South Pacific Regional Environment Programme (SPREP) Director-General Sefa Nawadra co-facilitated the Talanoa, with Pacific Islands Forum (PIF) Deputy Secretary-General Esala Nayasi.
- There was a strong level of Ministerial participation, particularly from countries that have taken on Pacific Political Climate Champion roles. This included Fiji, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu and Vanuatu.
- Australia and Turkey have competing bids to host COP31 in 2026. A decision on which country will host the annual UN Climate event requires consensus by the relevant regional grouping whose turn it is to host under the rotational system the 'Western Europe and Others Group'. s6(a) s6(a)
- At the Talanoa, there was strong regional support for Australia's bid, including from New Zealand. I emphasised that a 'Pacific COP' in Australia would be a significant opportunity to increase representation and participation for our region and deliver on Pacific priorities. I also reinforced New Zealand's commitment to supporting climate resilience in the Pacific and global climate action.

- The Talanoa offered an opportunity to hear directly from Pacific partners on their climate change priorities in advance of COP29 in Baku Azerbaijan, following the first Pacific Small Island Developing States Ministerial-level pre-COP in many years.
- The Talanoa presented an opportunity to deepen relationships with my counterparts in the Pacific. I hosted a dinner for my Ministerial counterparts. I also held a series of bilateral meetings with Ministers from the region, including from Australia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Samoa, Fiji, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu. The bilateral meetings were a useful opportunity to engage with partners and discuss our key regional priorities for climate action.
