- agreed that he be accompanied by one member of staff; 2
- approved the estimated expenditure of up to \$31,900 for the travel expenses of the 3 Ministerial party, as a charge to Vote: Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive – Travel);
- noted that he will be accompanied by officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and 4 Trade, whose travel costs will be met by the Ministry;
- agreed that in his absence Hon Stuart Nash act as Minister of Agriculture, Minister for 5 Biosecurity, Minister for Food Safety and Minister for Rural Communities;
- **noted** that the House is not sitting during his absence. 6

- I seek Cabinet approval to travel to Siem Reap, Cambodia from 28 February to 4 March 2019, to represent New Zealand at a Ministerial negotiating meeting of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) free trade agreement.

4 RCEP negotiations advanced substantially in 2018, with conclusion of a further five chapters, and market access negotiations in goods, services and investment moving towards their final stages. At the RCEP Summit in Singapore in November (which the Prime Minister attended), Leaders pledged that countries were "determined to conclude a modern, comprehensive, high-quality and mutually beneficial RCEP in 2019". ^{\$6(a); \$6(b)}

It will be important to continue to show a strong political-level commitment to RCEP, and also ASEAN's goal, at this meeting s6(a); s9(2)(j)

This meeting is the first RCEP Ministerial-level meeting scheduled for 2019, and is being hosted by Cambodia to show its (and other ASEAN LDCs') political support and commitment to the ongoing RCEP negotiating process, and to set the scene for the year ahead. It is likely that ASEAN will use this meeting to discuss a range of issues relating to market access and rules, seeking to maintain political pressure to demonstrate progress to Leaders.

I will take the opportunity to meet bilaterally with these countries at this meeting to continue to prosecute New Zealand's requests, defend our core needs, and seek beneficial market access outcomes.

I will also take the opportunity to further strengthen my relationships with my Trade Ministerial counterparts from like-minded countries, to ensure that New Zealand's interests are advanced and protected in the negotiation.
